 - A brief history
 - Office founded in 1968
 - Provides access to administrators
 - What is an Ombudsperson
 - Neutral party who can provide informal and confidential assistance
- When to reach out
 - Anytime you have a question about existing policy
 - Support in interactions within the University
 - Unsure who to contact to discuss a particular problem
 - Want to discuss a situation in a confidential setting
